

The 8800 acre campus of Stanford University is located adjoining Palo Alto on the Peninsula, about 35 miles south of San Francisco. It is readily accessible from U. S. Route 101, either from San Francisco airport on the north or from San Jose on the south. Facilities for housing and meals will be available on the campus. Open to those staying on campus are the library, bookstore, and physical recreation facilities, including swimming pools and golf course.

Conferees will be housed at Stern Hall on the Campus from Monday, August 28, through Friday morning, September 1. Meals will be available for the group in nearby Wilbur Hall; the first meal will be Monday evening dinner and the last will be Friday breakfast. Housing costs are \$6 daily for a single; \$8 daily for a double (2 persons). Food costs are \$5 daily; meals will be cafeteria-style with a special dinner on Wednesday evening at no additional expense. All those living on campus are expected to eat on campus. Those who may be living off campus may join at meals at rate of \$1.25 for breakfast, \$1.50 for lunch, and \$2.25 for dinner. Children 11 years of age or younger will be charged half-rate for housing and for food.
