TRANSPORTATION

(a) Those flying can take a 14-mile taxi ride to York University for about \$6. (b) For those driving, York U. is in the north-western section of metro Toronto. Take Hwy 401 (Macdonald-Cartier Freeway) from East or West; from the South take Queen Elizabeth Way (QEW) towards Toronto onto Hwy 27 North onto 401 East. Take Keele Street exit North for approx. 4.0 miles; turn left on second access road to York University (St. Lawrence Blvd.) which is main entrance. Ask guard for winters college or veer right at traffic circle, turn left at York Road into Winters College parking lot.

ROOMS AND MEALS are in Winters College or in one of the 3 adjoining colleges. Rooms are \$6.12 per person per day. Meal tickets are required for the cafeteria: breakfast \$1.02, lunch \$1.53, dinner \$2.04. Nine meals, including banquet, cost \$17.71.
