Pre-meeting Activities

Friday, July 31, 2009 Workshop: 8:30 AM–4:30 PM includes all materials and lunch. "Teaching about Science and Christianity" – The morning session will introduce participants to teaching about science and Christianity in college level courses. The afternoon will introduce the video/book course featuring "Test of Faith", a Faraday Church Resource Project. Significant time is allotted for discussion in both sessions. Friday, July 31

1. HOT (Heart of Texas) Renewable Energy Tour

8:30-12:30 PM

A half-day trip to visit two or three sites in the Waco area where renewable energy projects are in place. Renewable energy facilities to generate methane from city sewage at one site and/or from cow manure at the second site will be included in this tour along with a visit to experimental sites for solar and wind power.

Limit: 16 Cost: \$11.

2. Waco Wetlands, Waco Cameron Park Zoo and Waco Cameron Park 1:30-5:00 PM The Waco nature tour will include a visit to an ecological site where wetlands have been created by diverting water from a river. This diversion has prevented the water level in Lake Waco from rising seven feet, which would have destroyed significant habitats around the lake. Cameron Park Zoo is in a beautiful setting with lush vegetation and a combination of exotic animals from Africa and a wonderful collection of animals from various regions of Texas. Cameron Park with a remarkable variety of plant life is adjacent to the Brazos River in Waco and is the second largest park in the U.S. inside city limits (after Central Park in New York). Limit: 20

3. Mayborn Museum, Texas Ranger Hall of Fame & Museum, and the Texas Sports Hall of Fame. (This is a walking tour to three museums) 1:30-5:00 PM

The Mayborn Museum is a science museum which is wonderful fun for adults and children alike, providing hands-on opportunities to perform experiments that demonstrate the wonders of nature (including physics, chemistry, and biology). It is the fifth largest museum of its kind in the U.S. The Texas Ranger and Texas Sports Halls of Fame are fun introductions to Texas legends and folklore. *Each museum has an admission fee of \$6.00 which you pay at the door.*Limit: None—within walking distance.

4. Dinosaur Valley (Paluxy River near Glen Rose)

8:30-12:30 PM

Paluxy River near Glen Rose, Texas, includes many dinosaur tracks from a variety of dinosaurs, and the park also includes scale models of the creatures that would have left these tracks.

Limit: 20 Cost: \$45.

5. Introduction to Texas trip to Austin; Texas Capitol Complex; Bob Bullock Texas State History Museum, and IMAX Theatre, University of Texas 8:30-5:00 PM

All day field trip will be a special treat for those who are interested in Texas history and culture. Austin is the state capital. The capitol building is the largest state capitol and it is taller than the U.S. Capitol in Washington (something Texans would naturally want to know). The Bob Bullock Texas State Museum is a treasure-house of the history of Texas under its six flags (Spain, France, Mexico, the Country of Texas (after it won independence from Mexico), the Confederacy, and, of course, the United States of America. With videos and many historical displays, this is a wonderful museum.

The University of Texas is the second largest university in the United States and is one of the top ten state universities in the country. On the campus is the L.B. Johnson Library and Museum where we may make a brief stop, if there is sufficient interest. Lunch on your own.



Lodging


Accommodations are available Thursday through Sunday nights.
