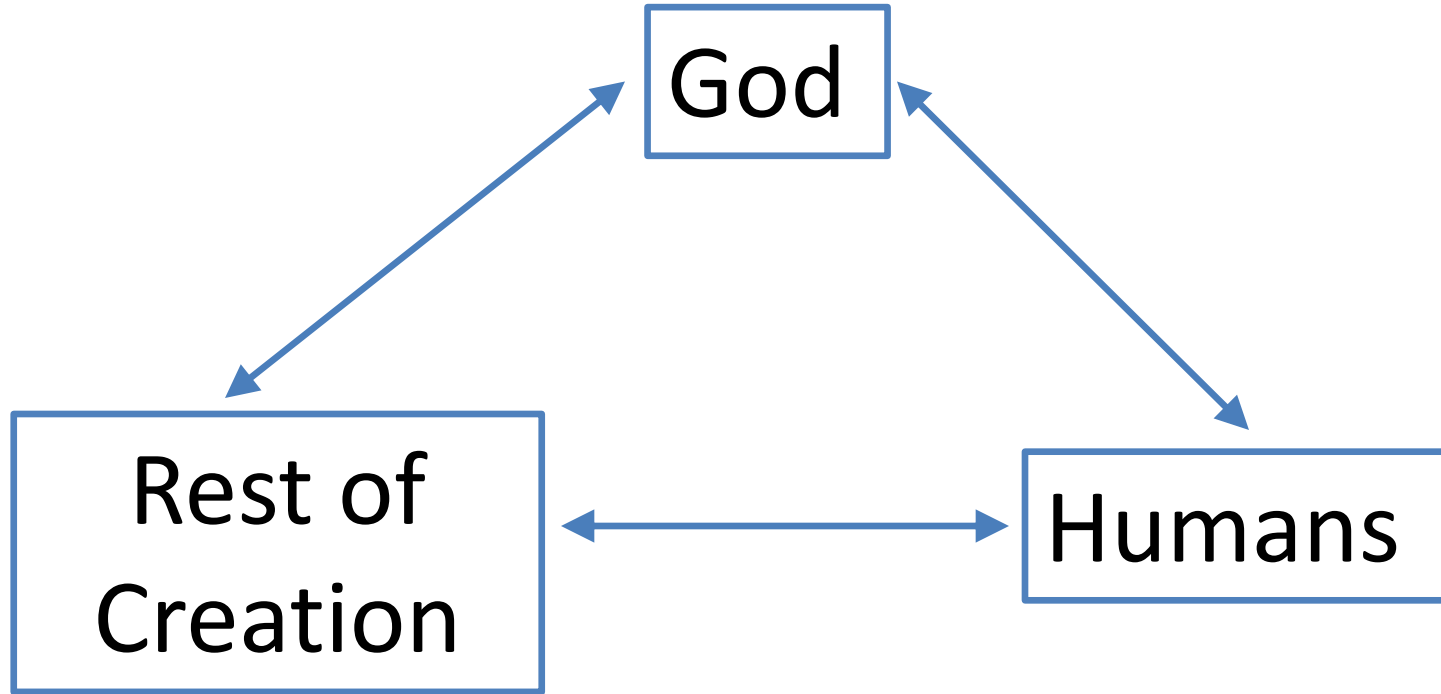
Chain of Being / Hierarchy / Dominion

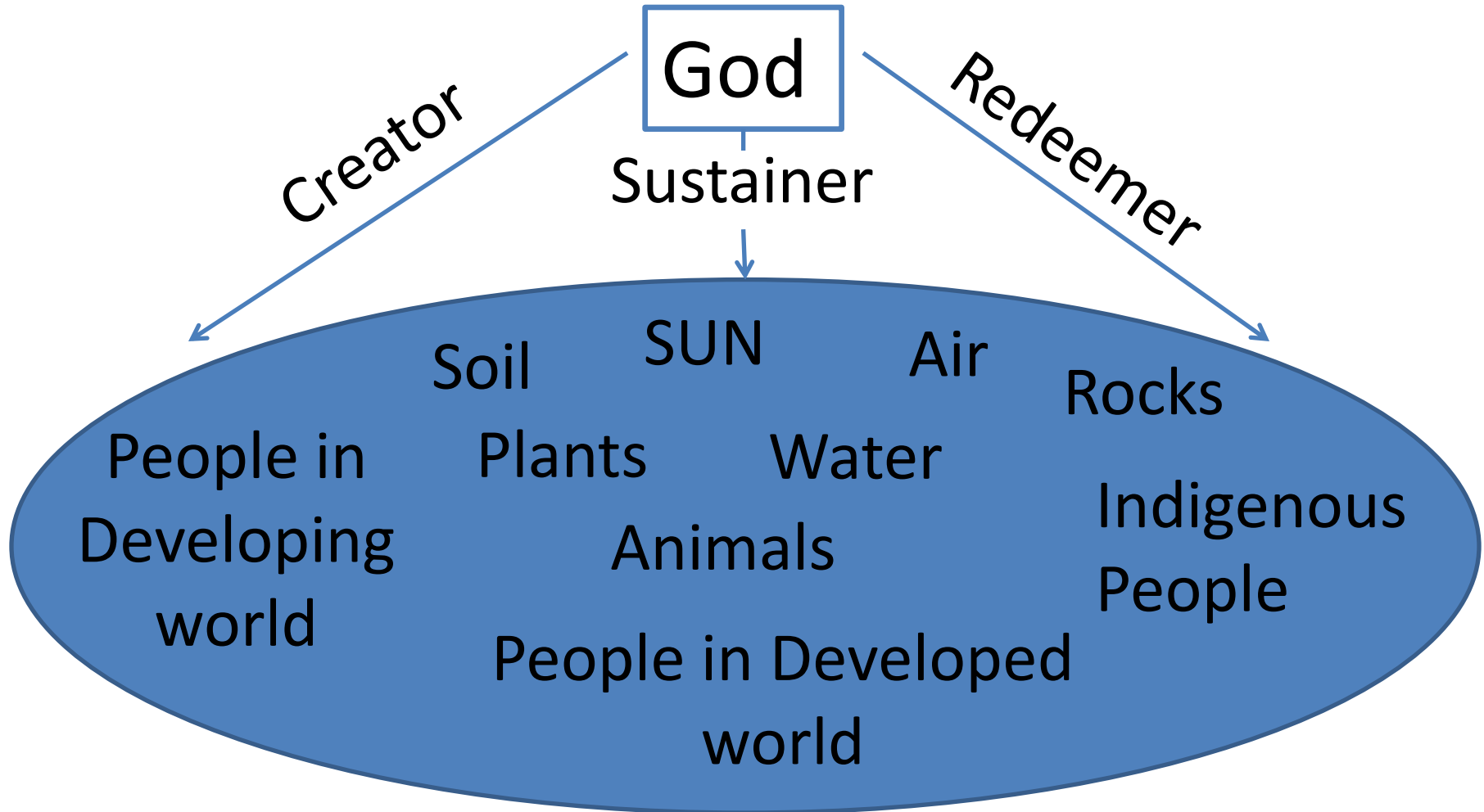


Stewardship Model / Hierarchy
