

Our topical areas for parallel oral sessions are as follows:

- Physical Sciences: Physics, Chemistry, Astronomy, Cosmology
 How do we understand the relationship between the physical sciences and Christian theology?
- **Life Sciences**: Biology, Medicine, Bioethics Going beyond the traditional creation/evolution dialogue to examine how current research informs and is informed by Christian faith.
- Mind Sciences: Behavioral Sciences, Neuroscience, Psychiatry
 How do these sciences enable us to understand the renewal of our minds with the mind of Christ?
- Environmental Sciences: Ecology, Geology, Meteorology/Climate
 What are appropriate ways for these disciplines to facilitate our roles as stewards of the earth?
- Christian Women in Science and Engineering
 Considering methods for increasing the participation of Christian women in STEM fields and the means
 by which that participation benefits society and brings glory to God.
- **Design in Nature**: Engineering, Computing, Information Theory, Technology How do we understand creation in relation to our own creative abilities?
- Science Education
 How do we faithfully and sustainably transmit scientific information to the next generations?
- Theology and Biblical Literature
 How does science influence theology and biblical studies, and vice versa?

REQUIREMENTS, GUIDELINES, AND DEADLINES FOR ABSTRACT SUBMISSIONS

- 1. All abstracts must be 50-250 words.
- 2. Each abstract must emphasize what your oral presentation offers that is new and important for the topic chosen. The abstracts will be considered if they fit within the overall theme of the conference and if they can be otherwise accommodated within the limits of the conference. Provide sufficient detail to be informative, but use language that will be intelligible to a nonspecialist or a scientist from outside your field.
- 3. Authors may submit only one abstract for which they are the primary author. Additional abstracts listing individuals as secondary co-authors may also be submitted.
- 4. Please note: Abstracts should be based on work in your area of disciplinary expertise. Where this is not obvious, you may be asked to provide suitable documentation. Exceptions to this policy may be made for abstracts demonstrating exceptional originality and scholarship outside your field of expertise.
- 5. Oral presentations will be limited to 20 minutes plus 5 minutes for discussion.
- 6. All presenters must register for the meeting no later than Monday, **June 1, 2015**.
- 7. All abstracts must be submitted online using the Call for Abstracts <u>form</u>. Please select the appropriate topical area.
- 8. Upload your abstract as a Word or rich text format file. Please begin your abstract with the title and name of author(s) and save it with the filename, ASA2015YourLastName.
- 9. **Deadline:** All abstracts must be submitted on or before **February 28, 2015**.

INFORMATION ON SCHOLARSHIPS FOR EARLY CAREER SCIENTISTS AND GRADUATE AND UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS IN THE SCIENCES AND ENGINEERING

We invite early career scientists (post docs or those within the first three years of receiving your latest degree) and graduate and undergraduate students to participate in the ASA Annual Meeting, July 24–27, 2015, on the campus of Oral Roberts University, Tulsa, Oklahoma.

A number of members have graciously provided funding for a limited number of scholarships. Scholarships are available to ASA members on a first-come, first-served basis to those who submit an abstract for an oral presentation and who attend the whole meeting. These scholarships will cover on-campus housing (double occupancy) and meals at the conference. The deadline for submitting your proposed abstract is **February 28, 2015**.

This meeting provides an opportunity to meet professionals in your field who share your Christian faith; to hear prominent plenary speakers; to participate in the oral sessions; to give an oral presentation yourself; to network and fellowship with other Christians from a wide variety of colleges, universities, and research institutions; and to explore how to integrate your faith with your discipline. The ASA Annual Meeting will provide an excellent opportunity for you to share your research with Christian colleagues. Your oral presentation can be listed on your résumé as being presented at a professional meeting; it can strengthen your applications for further training, grants, or career advancement.
